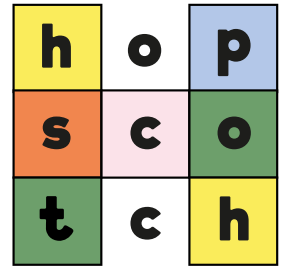


Hopscotch Art Space FAQs



Q: Is it totally free? What's the catch?

A: Yes, it's totally free, there's no catch!

Q: Do I need to book?

A: Sessions will be drop in and drop out, so you don't need to book or reserve a space. Pop in and have a look at what's on!

Q: Is it open to everyone?

A: Yes absolutely! As long as your kids are 11 and under and interested in arts and crafts, everyone is welcome!

Q: Will Hopscotch families get priority access?

A: We will be operating on a first come, first serve basis, and as this is a community driven project, we are aiming to spread the Hopscotch warmth to families who aren't already familiar with who we are.

Q: How long can we stay? What would you recommend?

A: The space is drop in/drop out, so you are welcome to stay as long as you and your family would like. I would recommend settling in for 30-90 minutes to relax and enjoy.

Q: Can we leave children unaccompanied?

A: No, the Art Space is not a childcare facility, and is not set up as one. It is important for your child's safety that you stay with them throughout the session.

Q: How many adults and children can you accommodate at any one time?

A. About 25 adults and children can comfortably craft within the Space.

Q: What happens if the space is full but we'd like to take part? Will there be a queuing or ticketing system?

A: At the moment we have no queuing system in place for the Art Space, we'd recommend a walk around the Lanes and popping back in to see if space has cleared up. As this project is brand new we plan to assess the community need and implement a digital queuing system if necessary.

Q: What are the opening hours?

A: Initially we will be open from 10am - 3pm on Saturdays and Sundays. After Summer Holidays have finished opening times will be 10am - 3pm Wednesday - Sunday.

Q: What can children do in the Art Space?

A: The space will give them free reign to explore arts and crafts, there will be options set up each day that you can partake in independently, and there will be workshops led by a variety of local artists to inspire creative expression. Highlights include screen printing, textile collages, music led making and sun printing!

Q: Can I bring older children over 11 years old, with my younger children?

A: We welcome older siblings to come along with the family and enjoy the space. We ask all guests are respectful of the space, and supplies, and that older children are mindful of volume levels to ensure the space remains a comfortable place to create.

Q: Can I bring my child with SEND who is over 11 years old, but would benefit from the new Art Space?

A: Yes, absolutely.

Q: Is it fully accessible for families with disabilities?

A: The space is unfortunately not wheelchair accessible. The entrance door is on ground level but narrow as is traditional with old buildings in Brighton. The washroom is accessible through a narrow door as well as down one step.

Q: Is there space for wheelchairs?

A: As above, the space is unfortunately not wheelchair accessible as the entry is less than a meter wide. We encourage you to give us a ring or drop an email to artspace@hopscotchmail.com before you visit so your Art Space experience can be as smooth as possible. If the wheelchair is foldable it is possible to store in the back of the space.

Q: Is there space to park pushchairs?

A: We have a storage room to accommodate buggies and baggage, but keep in mind that the space is intimate and being shared, so smaller buggies are preferred.

Q: Can I bring along my baby?

A: Of course!

Q: Are there changing facilities and toilets?

A: Yes, we have a toilet and changing facilities available.
